FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello beloved Bethel members!

The saga of questions and answers continues. As you read the questions and my answers I encourage you to think about those questions yourself, and maybe next Lent you'd be willing to be interviewed!

Where do you find joy in your everyday life?

I find joy in the big and little things. It's easy to be overwhelmed by everything in life. Sometimes – and I do mean just sometimes – when I'm feeling incredibly overwhelmed, stressed out, and easily angered – I stop myself and take a deep breath and just look around me. If I'm outside I sit down and just enjoy the wind blowing through the trees and across my face, listening to the birds sing, dogs bark, and cars drive by. If I'm inside I sit and shut my eyes and just breathe, listening to the silence and focusing on calming my body. In those moments I find quiet joy in the noise of nature outside or the quiet stillness inside. But sometimes I don't manage to make myself stop and find joy because there is no quiet stillness because kids are there laughing, screaming, whatever and there is too much to get done. If I can manage it in those moments of complete, noisy chaos with the kids, I just watch them, and try to find the humor in a teen having a teen moment, or joy in the fact that the siblings are all getting along and having fun, laughing together. There are so many things to be frustrated, angry, and stressed about every day, but there are also small joys and I try to notice them when I can because those are the moments worth living for.

When you are faced with something difficult to do – how do you approach it?

This one is hard. It really just depends on what the difficult thing is. If it involves another person I try to be honest, open, and caring, though sometimes I have to take some time to myself to center myself and calm down before I can be open and caring with another. If it doesn't involve another person, then I tend to use a rip off the band aid approach. Better to just get whatever it is over with as quickly and efficiently as possible.

What does it mean to you to be human?

It means God created me to be emotional, to love and care for God, creation, and one another. It means that there will be difficult days, when nothing seems to go right, and I feel like I have failed in everything I've tried. It means there will be wonderful days, when everything goes perfectly, and I feel like everything has been orchestrated by a master hand. It means days of feeling alone and forgotten, and days of feeling loved and seen. It means that I am both a saint and a sinner. It means that I own nothing, and God owns everything, that I am just taking care of everything God has given me, as a steward-taking care of the income I receive wisely, investing some of it, donating some of it, spending some of it; taking care of my children, husband, parents, siblings, and all the people who have entered my life by loving them, showing them kindness, forgiving them when they wrong me, and doing my best not to wrong them; taking care of the world around me by picking up litter, letting the wild stay wild, being as energy efficient as I can be – all this while knowing that I'm inevitably going to misuse the income I receive at some point – investing in the wrong thing, not donating enough, spending too much; knowing that I'm inevitably going to wrong the people I'm meant to care for at some point even if it's unintentionally; knowing that I'm going to hurt the world I'm meant to protect at some point all because I'm an emotional being, I'm both a saint and a sinner.

Hymn Notes

In the article "History of Hymns: Lord, Whose Love in Humble Service" by Sarah Bilaye-Benibo, the following information gives insight into the thoughts of Albert F. Bayly who wrote the text for this hymn. "Lord, Whose Love Through Humble Service" consists of four stanzas that describe the servant leadership of Christ, while prayerfully encouraging others to follow his example. The first stanza focuses solely on the work of Christ who "did not come to be served, but to serve and to give life as a ransom for man." (Mark 10:45, NIV). In the second stanza, by repeating the word still, Bayly emphasizes the present reality of marginalized people. He petitions the Holy Spirit to do the work of Christ and heal them; then he puts the onus on us. The third stanza asks God to grant us vision, so that we're able to see the burdens of the weak. In the fourth stanza Bayly closes by calling out the recipients of our service: "the child, the youth, [and] the aged." He implies that the function of worship is an act that leads people out of the four walls of the church. Being the hands and feet of Jesus, we are all empowered and mandated to love, hope, restore to health, have goodwill, comfort, counsel, aid, and give peace.






3. Bethel offering envelope

Council Members Present: President: Ron Foust; Vice President: Peggy Wick; Secretary: Cathy Houg; Treasurer: Jill Duncan; Finance Board: Sara Jepsen; Education Board: Pete Hallberg; Trustee Board: Dave Gohl; Pr. Molly Wills **Call to Order:**

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 by President Ron Foust followed a prayer led by Pastor Molly.

Council Business:

- A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Cathy Houg to approve the agenda with one addition under new business. Motion carried.
- Pastor Molly Wills reported that she will be attending the Festival of Homiletics on Monday, May 13, 2024. She
 attended the Youth Task Force planning meeting and the Youth Social at City Hall. Feedback on the Lenten
 Services and Maundy Thursday Service has been positive. She is working on a funeral packet to hand out to
 families with information and guidelines to follow when a loved one passes.

Old Business:

- The Easter Brunch served by the Church Council served 90-100 people with \$375 raised for McLeod County Foodshelf.
- A motion was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Pete Hallberg extending the agreement with Resplandor de Gloria to rent Bethel Church for their worship on Sundays from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Motion carried. "The Chosen" group will explore options into working around this schedule.

New Business:

- After some discussion, a stewardship campaign was tabled until next meeting.
- Stove replacements were discussed. Pete Hallberg will work with the WELCA group/Kitchen Committee to bring a recommendation to the Church Council for approval.

Secretary Minutes:

• A **motion** was made by Jill Duncan and seconded by Ron Foust to accept March's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Reports:

• A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Pete Hallberg to accept March's treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary Report:

• A **motion** was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Cathy Houg to accept March's financial secretary's report. Motion carried.

Reports:

1) Education Board:

- A motion was made by Sara Jepsen and seconded by Cathy Houg to purchase a child protection Ministry Mobilizer Bundle for \$149. Motion carried. This company facilitates background screening and child safety training. Each person will need to pay a nominal fee to receive training.
- Three young people will receive first communion on Sunday, April 14, 2024.
- The third graders' Bibles have been received, but a date for presentation is still pending.

2) Finance Board:

• There was no business from Finance Board.

3) Trustees:

- Water that leaked into the basement Sunday School room was cleaned up. Because of concern about mold, the Trustees will get an appraisal to assess damage and provide suggestions for remediation. The Council agreed that the Sunday School class should be moved out of that room and into the room across the hall (Steve Klobe's old Sunday School room.)
- The Trustees are getting quotes to repaint the bell tower.
- Security and Sound from St. Bonifacius has checked and hopefully corrected the distortion in the sound system during live streaming.

Communications:

- The Trustees will set a date for Spring Clean-Up and provide a congregational sign-up sheet.
- Cemetery Clean-Up is April 27, 2024, with people meeting at the original cemetery.
- On April 14, 2024, the Mid Minnesota Band will perform at Bethel Lutheran preceded by a luncheon from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
- The next Church Council meeting was changed from May 13 to May 6, 2024.

The meeting closed with Round Table Prayers followed by the Lord's Prayer.

The next regular Council meeting will be held on Monday, May 6, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.
