"There is a Balm in Gilead"

(Today's Communion Hymn) The phrase "balm of Gilead" is a symbol of healing and soothing that comes from the Hebrew Bible, where it is mentioned in Genesis 37:5 and Jeremiah 8:22. The phrase is named after the region of Gilead, where a rare perfume with medicinal properties was produced from a tree or shrub.

The anonymous writers of the African American spiritual, There is a Balm in Gilead, identified with the struggles, oppression, and desperation of the Old Testament forebearers of faith. This hymn was created as a song of hope, healing, and restoration.

Because of Christ, there is healing, hope and comfort for the sick both spiritually and physically. Christ's sacrifice on the cross gives us new life in Him. By the wounds we have been healed of our sin. (1 Peter 2:24)
