FROM PASTOR MOLLY

Hello Beloved Children of God!

This month is the last month of questions and answers from the Lenten questions! Remember as you read I encourage you to think about these questions for yourself. They are great for self-reflection and defining your own relationship with God.

Have you ever felt forgotten by God? What did/does that feel like? If that feeling is past, what did it feel like to feel remember by God?

Yes, there was a point that for years I felt forgotten by God. It didn't necessarily feel negative except at some rough points during those years. For me it felt like I was in a bubble, separate and alone, even when I was surrounded by people, people that cared about me and loved me. I was living and surviving, just getting through the day in order to go to sleep and do it all over again. During the particularly rough parts, it felt crushing. My heart was trampled, and I was completely alone with no one to turn to (or so I felt). At the time, we (my husband, 2 oldest kids, and I) were living in Oklahoma. During those last years there while in the mental/emotional state I was in, feeling forgotten, alone, depressed, I started to feel like the only way to get better was to leave there, that if we just moved back north everything would be better. It didn't matter if it was lowa where I grew up, Minnesota, Wisconsin, just somewhere north. The feeling was a pressure, a hope, a dream, a wish, a prayer. Eventually we managed to, though up to and at that point there was the ever-hovering question of whether I really would be better once we moved. Interestingly enough, I was. Looking back on it, that pressure I felt, was God calling to me, trying to pull me out of the pit I had sunk into. Moving is certainly not always the answer for everyone or in every situation, but for that it was. God was calling me home for healing, and I listened, in turn I was healed. I realized as time went on, that God had never forgotten me. That instead I had turned my back on God, and I just didn't know how to turn back around and face him again. It was me who forgot for all that it didn't feel like it in the moment. I realized God had been there the whole time, just waiting for me to hear him and respond.

How do you find/feel/lean on God in the hard times?

This is hard, oh so hard, as you can tell from above's answer. It is not always easy to recognize that we've turned our backs on God, that we aren't really leaning on God even when we think we are. I went through the motions of worship, of singing praise, even of journaling. All the things I normally do to find, feel, and lean on God, but in those hard times sometimes it just doesn't feel like enough. That's not an answer most would expect or want to hear, but it's the truth. Having gone through that point in my life, for me at least, the way I have found that is most helpful to lean on and feel God in the hard times so that I don't turn my back on God again is to rage at him. To find a place that I can scream and cry out loud, to write poetry full of pain and anger, to beg and plead, until I feel completely empty. Empty of tears, empty of words, and I can just sit in the silence, listening, and imagine I feel God's arms wrapping around me, hear the words, "I love you. You are mine," whispered in my mind, and I know I'm not alone.

These Lenten questions I ask are hard. I expect my confirmation students to be thinking about them and answer them in their faith statements. As adults, they can sometimes be even harder because of everything we have lived through, they can dredge up painful memories if we let ourselves sit in them. But these questions are important to think on, and though the answers will change as we age and experience good and bad things throughout life, God will always be with us, loving us, and reaching out his hand to us, all we have to do is remember reach back.

<u>All Saints Sunday</u> <u>November 3, 2024</u>






3. <u>Bethel offering envelope</u>
