MUSIC NOTES

There is a Balm in Gilead relates to the second reading and is today's communion hymn. The phrase "balm of Gilead" is a symbol of healing and soothing that comes from the Hebrew Bible, where it is mentioned in Genesis 37:25 and Jeremiah 8:22. The phrase is named after the region of Gilead, where a rare perfume with medicinal properties was produced from a tree or shrub.

The anonymous writers of the African American spiritual, There is a Balm in Gilead, identified with the struggles, oppression, and desperation of the Old Testament forebearers of faith. This hymn was created as a song of hope, healing, and restoration.

Because of Christ, there is healing, hope, and comfort for the sick both spiritually and physically. Christ's sacrifice on the cross give us new life in Him. By his wounds we have been healed of our sin (1 Peter 2:24).

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.
